Dear Friends,

Just starting to arise out of the depths of a long cold winter, which as you will see from the list of funerals, has taken its toll on our community, we now turn our thoughts thankfully to Spring, the season of new birth. Already in one or two of the gardens locally there is a glimpse of the green shoots of new growth bursting through the soil, until recently hardened by frost or covered by snow. I think this is my favourite time of year, with the snowdrop my favourite flower, because it is usually the first to show and after the cold, dark winter brings with it the promise of warmer, brighter days ahead.

We celebrate new birth in worship with Baptisms on Sundays the 6th and 13th of February and hope you can join us for worship on these days. These services will be family (all age services) where the children of the church will be with us for all the service and we will sing some cheery choruses, and the minister (I promise) won't speak for so long. These services are part of the new beginnings we are trying for our Sunday School. On non-family service Sundays the children will spend the hour in the Church Hall in a "Junior Church", with their own songs, prayers, talks and activities, which they haven't had time to do with the time split between Church and Sunday School in the past. They will however still come into church a couple of Sundays per month to special services geared for their enjoyment and participation. We want to try and give our children the best and most positive experience of being at Mure Memorial, and therefore of the name of Jesus Christ.

At the other end of the age spectrum it has come to our attention that a number of our members are moving into nursing home care without the appropriate follow-up from the congregation. We are really sorry about this neglect, especially if you or your loved ones have experienced it, and we aim to put some new practices into place which will ensure a more caring continuation of the pastoral care on offer from the congregation. Along with other changes which we will say more about next month, there will be an increased opportunity for volunteers to help us in the wider work of the church. I hope you may see this as an opportunity for a new beginning for the congregation and even for yourself as you play your part in building the warmer and brighter future of Mure Memorial.



Can You Help?







Baillieston Mary's Meals Projects

Dear Supporter



On behalf of all the volunteers who work on the projects in St Bridget's Parish Centre each Tuesday and Thursday, I am writing to thank you and all who have been so faithful in supporting our efforts during 2010.

Goods donated for backpacks have been utilised and since January, 2530 filled bags have been sent to disadvantaged children in Liberia and Haiti. This brings our total bag pack contribution to 4,560 since August 2008.

Donated goods were delivered to the Mary's Meals shop in Duke Street and helped boost funds to feed children. <u>It costs an average of £9.00 to feed one child for one year.</u>

On 12th January 2010, it was proposed that we would raise £7,000 to provide a feeding station in Malawi. This target was achieved on the 12th December 2010. The kitchen has been allocated to Sanjika School which is run by the Malawian Government in Mphande Region of the Mawanza District of Southern Malawi. Currently 1009 pupils attend the school. The completion date for the construction of this school kitchen is April 2011.

We always welcome new volunteers, especially car drivers who can spare some time to help us transport goods to Duke Street.
