

Dear Friends,

There seems to be nothing more changeable than the British weather. One minute you're in a deep frost then you're sweltering in balmy temperatures and shedding clothes. You travel from east to west or from north to south and again you seem to have moved into a different weather zone.

Of course, it isn't just the weather that changes. Clearly both in the UK and America there have been big political changes, with Prime Ministers and Presidents moving in and out, as well as the ins and outs of our relationship with Europe.

This of course also brings a freedom to allow things around us to change. We are no longer dependent on people and places on which to rest. We can see the freedom, family, community and church has to change without needing to feel threatened or anxious because the God we worship is what we put our trust in. It is the sure and steadfast anchor for our souls, what else could we possibly need. Entering 2017 we may not know what the future may hold, but we know who holds the future.

My grateful thanks to all the volunteers who willingly gave of their time and talents to make this event work! Not to be outdone, the YF had a film and takeaway night in the church and the following week went to Laser Tag and

dodgems at Braehead, which all the young people enjoyed!

Looking forward, and all groups are already back up and running. The SU groups at Garrowhill and Bannerman are looking at life events in the life of Jesus, picking up from the Christmas story and going right through to the events at Easter. This is a topic the YF will also be following in their devotions on a Sunday evening. At the Happitots nursery, their Bible Stories will be looking at great characters in the Old Testament, before looking at the Easter story. As ever, I am always searching for ways and ideas to bring the Gospel to children and young people. To this end, I am signed up to an event in February to share ideas with how to be more involved in local schools. In March, I shall also be attending a conference aimed at Church of Scotland Youth Workers. I hope both events will bring renewed vigour and ideas to grow the Faith in our Children and Young People in our community.

### Mure Access Project – Update Report

We commenced looking for funding for our Mure Access Project (MAP) in 2012. This was a very ambitious project but we felt it was a necessity because of the access problems being encountered with our not so fit members and also for children buggies etc.

Our architects drew up detailed plans for submission approval Glasgow for Presbytery and also Church of Scotland to allow us to proceed with the proposed plan. also involved obtaining planning This permission which then resulted in having to get an expensive structural survey which alone cost approx £8000. The detailed plans were submitted for costing from various suppliers and this resulted in the cheapest quotation of approx £270,000. This then set us a task of trying to raise the necessary funding. However we submitted numerous applications but we only received a few smaller amounts and also some guarantees of amounts when the project was nearing completion. Our big problem with a few of the bigger applications we submitted (hoping to get £50,000 each from two of them) was that we had to prove that we had the necessary balance of finance before they would consider our applications. This became a "chicken and egg" situation as none would confirm they would give us the funding without this criteria being met. We are going to use up to £40,000 of the legacy received from Isabel Cunningham and also we have tried to raise as much from events and from you our congregation but this has not been sufficient to justify us getting these large applications accepted.

Since the start of our campaign in 2012 we have raised £34,215 (Standing Orders - £2,436, Gift Aid - £2,267, Donations, - £5,943, Fund Raising - £3,237, Community Development - £300, Grants Received - £4,500, Congregation Income - £15,532 We also received £2,825 from our Organisations giving us a total income of £37,040.

Our expenditure to out Architects and planning applications is £18,960. Our balance held at the end of December is £18,080. (If we use the £40,000 this gives us a currently availability of £58,080)

Our MAP committee are still looking for funding and holding events the first on 25<sup>th</sup> March is our Spring Fayre. We have decided that we will look again at our project and propose splitting it into 3 separate phases to see if we can raise the necessary funds for initially stage 1. This will again involve a restart on the funding applications but we are looking for a large help from you our congregation.
