Dear Friends,

While visiting Swinton Primary last Friday (13th Feb.) I had my first sighting of snowdrops for the year. I cannot tell you how much I appreciate the show of spring flowers that are starting to come through the ground at this time of year. After what seems to be a long cold winter (despite a week in Tenerife) to know the promise of better weather, longer days and even some heat, which springtime flowers offer gives you a little boost of energy to see winter out. It's not necessarily that it brings dramatic change, but it offers the promise, the hope of something better coming. It seems to me that as ordinary people we need that in our lives, even as Christians. We need to be reminded that the dark, depressing, despairing news both in the world around us and even in our family or community, is not the only reality, or even the main reality, but that God is moving to work His positive purposes out. God, who reveals Himself in Jesus Christ, has shown us a new world – a world of healing and hope, a world of peace and justice, and a world of caring and sharing - the world that is to come. From time to time that world breaks in to our experiences if we can only read it. Where we experience something of peace, healing, hope, faith, community, sharing, we are experiencing something of God which we can use to remind us of the good and positive future that is to come no matter how bleak the present. If we are able to bring that to others then so much the better! Like a little bunch of snowdrops bursting through the frozen ground to bring renewed life and hope to those who see them.

so our acts of goodness and grace can point people to God's future.

We are now in the season of Lent, which is not really practised within the Protestant tradition because the little acts of sacrifice - giving up chocolate, alcohol, or not taking the bus on short journeys, which others practise, were considered too petty and self-centred to reflect the sacrifice of Jesus at Easter. Lent, if it is to work at all in preparing us for Christ's sacrifice on the cross must call us to a spiritual transformation of self-sacrifice and devotion following the example of Christ. We could do no less than to be looking for those opportunities to plant some spring flowers in people lives by showing some love, acceptance and understanding to those who are lost and lonely; by offering the hand of forgiveness, grace and friendship to those who have hurt us or with whom we find it difficult to get on, perhaps inviting them for tea/coffee, lunch, dinner or a pint. We could offer to share the load with those who have a considerable burden, or stop putting more burdens on family members who are feeling oppressed.

There is much that can be done in Lent, but let's do it reminding ourselves that we are showing for the promises of Christ our Saviour. "Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

#### **Your Church Needs You**

Christian Aid Week 10th-16th May 2015

Christian Aid Week may seem a long way away right now but oh how quickly the months pass. Lent is under way and Easter is almost upon us. April will bring the Easter holidays and then at last the Bowling Green will be open. May will be here before we know it.

So this is an early appeal on behalf of your Christian Aid Week collectors. Every year our strong team of collectors diminishes ever so slightly, but in recent years we have unfortunately been left in a position where, out of 50 districts (a district being a street or one side of a street) 14 districts are vacant (no collector available for them), and 10 collectors are doing 2 or more districts.

Mure Memorial has a wonderful history of collecting for Christian Aid going back as far as 1998 with a collection of £1,979 and

an all-time high of £3,435 back in 2005 and 2006. Last year again our small but dedicated team of collectors, collected a marvellous total of £2,167.14. Our collections are always received with great thanks from the Christian Aid Team. There are many vacant districts, varying in size from 30 to 65 houses. It only

takes a couple of hours during Christian Aid Week to deliver, i.e. push the envelope through the letter box, and then go back to knock the door and collect it back in again.

So if anyone thinks that they might be able to help us out this year and make it our biggest ever collection, or, if you have any questions about collecting, then please don't hesitate to contact me.

#### Lodging House Mission Quarterly Prayer Letter Feb 2015

Dear Friends,

When we read the gospels we can find many references to Jesus at prayer.

Prayer is not a mysterious practice reserved only for clergy and the religiously devout. Prayer is simply *communicating with God*—listening and talking to him. Believers can pray from the heart, freely, spontaneously, and in their own words.

Let me share 3 things we can learn from Jesus prayer life.

#### First - Jesus believed that prayer works.

Matthew 7:7 - "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." The inference here is that if you don't ask then you won't receive.

### Second - Jesus prayed before making important decisions.

Luke 6:12-13 - "One of those days Jesus went out to a mountainside to pray, and spent the night praying to God. When morning came, he called his disciples to him and chose twelve of them, whom he also designated apostles." Jesus prayed

for guidance before making such an important decision – a decision that would later turn the world upside down.

Third - Jesus prayed for His disciples.

John 17:1; 15 - "Holy Father, protect them by the power of your name... My prayer is not that you take them out of the world but that you protect them from the evil one." Jesus recognised it was important to pray for the protection of his followers.

#### **Presbytery Report**

Our guest speaker at the February meeting of Presbytery was Dr Kenneth Jeffrey who is the Co-ordinator of the Centre for Ministry Studies at the University of Aberdeen. He explained that it was the aim of the centre to foster education and training for the whole people of God, those working at home and abroad, the ordained and the unordained. He reminded us that we are living in a hostile environment and we need to be equipped to serve, in order to carry out God's work. He gave brief details of some of the courses on offer which included an MTh in Ministries Studies on the subject -"What they didn't teach me when I did my BD".

Dr Doug Gay from Glasgow University also gave details of some of the courses which they are offering.

The Business Committee reported that the Committee set up to nominate the next Moderator of Presbytery was recommending the appointment of the Rev Tom Pollock of Sherbrooke St Gilbert's. You may remember Tom as the minister who led our last quinquennial visit. Presbytery was happy to approve his appointment.

The Property Committee reported that the congregation of St George's Tron are seeking approval in principle to the creation of a day cafe on the church premises. They had been in discussion with the Lodging House Mission with regards to staffing and training of

personnel to run the cafe. Environmental Health have given their support and the funding would come from a legacy. Approval in principle was given to allow them to further investigate this venture.

The Community Responsibility Committee asked Presbytery to note a suggestion for a Lenten Fast for three consecutive days during Holy Week using only food given in a typical food bank parcel containing 3 days' worth of food for 1 adult and 2 children. You can find out more at info@church-poverty.org.uk.

The Committee for Ecumenical Relations and Interfaith Matters intimated that they had communicated their prayerful concerns for Archbishop Phillip Tartaglia and his recovery from illness.

The World Mission Committee encouraged congregations to highlight Fair Trade Fortnight between 23<sup>rd</sup> February and 8<sup>th</sup> March. They reminded us that choosing Fairtrade products changes lives. A daily cuppa for us can mean clean water and education for tea farmers and their workers.

The Committee also highlighted the competition being run by the Church of Scotland World Mission Committee to celebrate the life and legacy of Mary Slessor and to mark the centenary of her death. Young people across Scotland are being asked how they would change the world for good in an innovative postcard competition. There will be prizes for different age groups and winning

entries will be on display at the Dundee Verdant Works in April.

Some of the girls from our Girls' Brigade are busy working on their entries at the moment and we are hoping for some successful entries.
