Yet we do this together, accepting each other for who we are, enjoying the things we enjoy together, like eating out, but also allowing time and space for personal interests and activities. If I were to tell Rena to read some theology she would give me my head to play with, and were I forced to sit in the sun all day


every day I would probably be suicidal with boredom. There is no right or definitive way to enjoy a holiday or how we grow.




- ◆ A one-off night – if you have any specialist activity in mind



Eco Congregation Scotland

You may be aware that Mure Memorial is now a registered Eco Congregation. The organisation that we are registered with is called Eco Congregation Scotland. It is a charity which encourages churches to incorporate environmental issues into their church life and mission.

Eco congregation Scotland run an award scheme to recognise the achievements of churches that register with them. We are hoping to be in a position to apply for their first level of award in the not too distant future.

This can be achieved by promoting activity in three areas:-

Promoting the link between the Christian Faith and environmental issues. This is achieved through church services and youth group activities.

Taking practical action in the church. For ourselves, our windows project would fall into this category.

Influencing attitudes and taking action in the local or global community. This normally entails establishing links in the

wider community related to environmental activities. At present, Mure Memorial is utilised by various groups in the community, and we also have a link with Garrowhill Primary School. These could be developed to fulfil this area of activity.
